Work continues on removing storage residue from the outside of the airplane in preparation for polishing.

Significant progress has been made by our volunteer historians, Doug and Mary Jo Reed. This week they located a pilot who flew our aircraft during its operational years with the Canadian survey firm, Kenting Aviation. Pictures, logs, and stories of the plane's activities during that period are being gathered by Doug and Mary Jo in what is becoming a very large research project.

As we mentioned last week, we are attempting to put together a fourth cleaning team that will work on Fridays. We are contacting potential volunteers in the order that they applied. We hope to have that team in place by April 1.

Don is well known for restoring B-17's and has taken a serious interest in our restoration project. The second event in April will be a strategic planning meeting to be held on the 9th of April.
